



COVID-19 pandemic remains a significant challenge in California

The COVID Delta variant is spreading faster and has stronger symptoms. Saban Community Clinic doctors and care teams are concerned about your health and the health of our at-risk patients.

Research has shown that the COVID-19 vaccines are safe and the most effective way to protect yourself from serious complications and hospitalizations related to COVID.

Updated In-Clinic Visitor Policy

Starting August 23, 2021, Saban will require all **visitors**, accompanying patients during their medical, dental, behavioral health visit or pharmacy pick-up to be fully vaccinated and provide proof or provide a negative COVID-19 test result taken within the previous 48 hours. Fully vaccinated means at least 2 weeks after the final dose in either a 2 dose vaccine series (Pfizer or Moderna) or the single dose series (Johnson & Johnson/Janssen).

The only visitor types that can accompany a patient during their visit are those serving as:

1. Caretaker for a patient with special needs
2. Patient's Power of Attorney (must provide notarized documentation)
3. An agent of a patient's Advance Healthcare Directive (must provide notarized documentation)

Visitors do not include Saban patients, or a parent that is accompanying their child for their visit. Please note, we can accommodate only one parent for each child's visit.

Vaccine Appointments

If you are not yet vaccinated, we urge you to make a vaccine appointment and get protected. The Delta variant spreads more easily, especially among those who aren't vaccinated.
